What Areas of the Brain May Show Abnormalities in Childhood Bipolar Disorder?

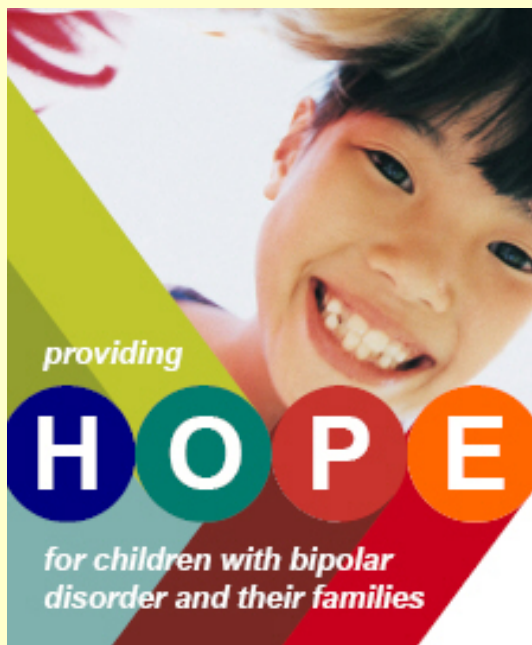
